

Introduction

Artists place easily removable tape onto their paper, color or paint the paper and carefully remove tape to reveal 'tape resist' design. Pinching and pulling tape is a great activity for developing fine motor muscles in the hand.



Supplies

- Washi or painter's tape
- Crayons, colored pencils, markers and/or watercolor paint
- Paintbrushes
- Children's scissors
- Paper (cardstock or watercolor paper for paint

Instructions

- 1. Tear or cut tape into pieces and place onto the paper to make a design (e.g. shapes, letters, anything goes!)
- 2. When artists are done with their tape design, use crayons/pencils/markers/paint to color the paper
- 3. Once done (or dry), carefully remove the tape to reveal the design


