Delight passersby with a rainbow in your window



STEAM Connections

• Art: you are using creativity to design a rainbow using supplies around your house; explore color

Supplies

- Paper: construction paper, copy paper, wrapping paper, scrapbook paper, etc.
- Yarn or string
- Tape or glue
- Scissors

- Cardboard (side of a cereal box) or poster board
- Other decorative items: buttons, foil, cotton balls, pom poms (optional)

Instructions

- 1. Draw a rainbow outline on the cardboard or poster board. You can cut it out before applying decorations or at the end
- Prepare your collage materials: tear or cut paper into various sizes and separate by color
- Use glue to apply the pieces onto the rainbow
- If using, attach other decorative items on top of the rainbow
- Once dry, cut a length of yarn and tape to the back of the collage
- Hang up your rainbow in your window, facing outside

Review

While your child is working on their collage, ask them guestions about their art:

- What color is this?
- How many (color) pieces do we have? How many do you want to add to the rainbow?
- What else in our home is this color?
