



Introduction

Work together to create a hanging "aquarium" in a window in your house using household craft supplies. Create creatures you already know about, or make something new and give it a name.



STEAM Connections

- Art: using basic supplies to create sea creatures and environments
- **Science:** identification of sea creatures and their environments

Supplies

- Paper: construction paper, copy paper, wrapping paper, scrapbook paper, etc.
- Wax paper
- Yarn or string
- Tape and/or glue
- Scissors
- Cardboard tubes
- Other decorative items: googly eyes, pipe cleaners and pom poms (optional)

Instructions

- 1. On paper, draw some of your favorite sea creatures, like fish, whales, octopuses or crabs
- 2. On paper or using other supplies, create underwater environments like seaweed, rocks, or coral
- 3. Use a hole puncher to put holes in your creatures/environments, and tie string or yarn in these holes in order to hang your designs in the window. You can also tape directly to the window
- 4. Once your window aquarium is up, talk about the different creatures and where they live


