

Introduction

Felt board storytelling is a fun, effective way to help your child increase their vocabulary and develop language skills, such as listening and talking. You can use a felt board and felt pieces as tools to encourage children to participate in storytelling, and your child can share familiar stories, such as fairy tales, or stories they create themselves.

As an enriching alternative, try incorporating counting or rhyming during this early literacy play!

Supplies

- Shoe box with lid
- Hot glue gun
- Ruler
- Scissors

- Fabric scissors
- Felt fabric
- Scotch tape
- Template (optional)





Instructions

- 1. Measure and cut felt background: With a ruler, measure the shoe box lid and cut the felt fabric to fit.
- 2. Glue background to lid: Using a hot glue gun, glue felt fabric to shoe box lid.
- 3. Cut flannel shapes: Use the template to cut flannel shapes, or create your own.
